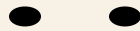

The Story of Eid al-Adha

Eid al-Adha is a special celebration that reminds us of Prophet Ibrahim's (Abraham's) strong faith in Allah.

Long ago, Prophet Ibrahim had a dream where Allah asked him to sacrifice what he loved most. This was his son, Ismail. Even though it was very difficult, Prophet Ibrahim decided to obey Allah.

When Prophet Ibrahim was about to sacrifice his son, Allah stopped him! Allah was pleased with Ibrahim's willingness to obey. Instead of sacrificing Ismail, Allah provided a ram (male sheep) to sacrifice instead.

- Obedience to Allah
- Faith and trust
- Sacrifice for what we believe in

What is Hajj?

Hajj is a special journey that Muslims make to Makkah in Saudi Arabia. It is one of the Five Pillars of Islam, which means it is very important! Every Muslim who is able to should try to perform Hajj once in their lifetime.

During Hajj, millions of Muslims from all over the world come together. They all wear simple white clothes called "Ihram." This shows that everyone is equal before Allah, no matter if they are rich or poor.

Important Places During Hajj

- **The Kaaba:** A cube-shaped building in Makkah. Muslims walk around it seven times. This is called Tawaf.
- **Mount Arafat:** Pilgrims stand here and pray to Allah. This is one of the most important parts of Hajj.
- **Mina:** Pilgrims stay in tents here and throw pebbles at three pillars. This reminds them of when Ibrahim threw stones at Shaytan (Satan) who tried to stop him from obeying Allah.

Steps of Hajj

Hajj has many important steps that pilgrims must follow:

1. Wear Ihram (special white clothes)
2. Perform Tawaf (walking around the Kaaba seven times)
3. Walk between Safa and Marwa hills seven times
4. Stand and pray at Mount Arafat
5. Collect pebbles at Muzdalifah
6. Throw pebbles at pillars in Mina
7. Sacrifice an animal
8. Cut or shave hair
9. Perform final Tawaf

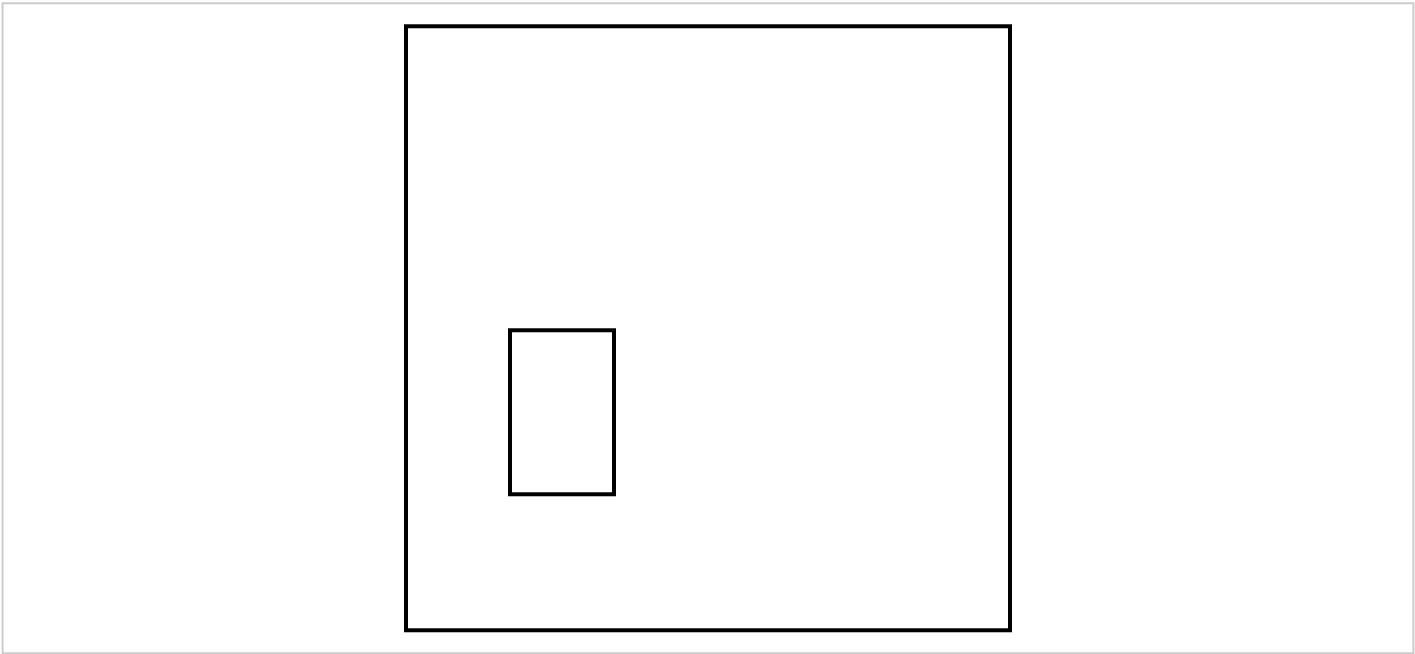

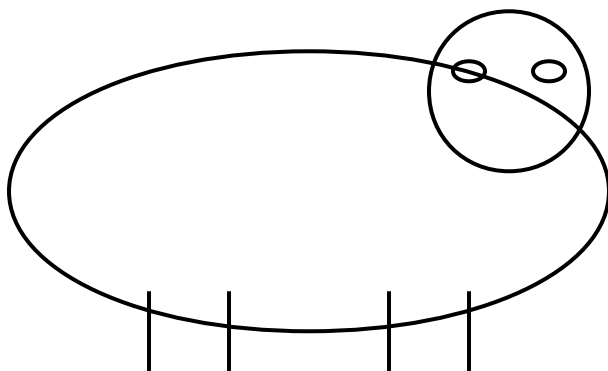

Eid al-Adha Celebrations

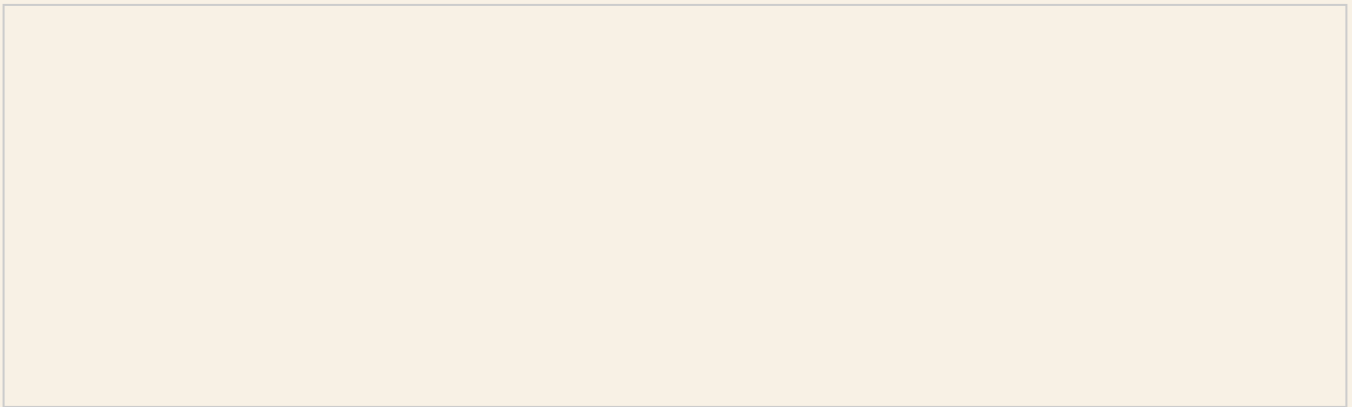
Eid al-Adha is a special holiday that comes after Hajj. It is also called the "Festival of Sacrifice." Muslims all over the world celebrate this day, even if they didn't go for Hajj.

How Do Muslims Celebrate Eid al-Adha?

- **Morning Prayer:** The day starts with a special prayer at the mosque.
- **New Clothes:** Many people wear their best or new clothes.
- **Sacrifice:** Families sacrifice an animal (usually a sheep, goat, or cow) and share the meat with family, friends, and those in need.
- **Visiting Family and Friends:** People visit their loved ones and share meals.
- **Giving Gifts:** Many people exchange gifts, especially with children.
- **Helping Others:** Muslims remember to help those who are less fortunate.

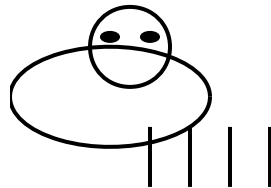
Paper Plate Sheep Craft

Materials needed:

- Paper plate
- Cotton balls or shredded paper
- Black construction paper
- Glue
- Scissors
- Googly eyes (optional)

Instructions:

1. Fold a paper plate in half
2. Cover the rounded part with cotton balls or shredded paper for the sheep's wool
3. Cut out a head and legs from black construction paper
4. Glue the head and legs to the paper plate
5. Add googly eyes or draw eyes on the head
